

Secure Hospitals in Insecure Environments?

The **International Hospital Federation** invites you to attend the upcoming webinar on **6 June 2018, 08:00 UTC**.

There is a great concern in violence affecting healthcare delivery facilities all over the world and ensuring safe access to healthcare in armed conflict and other emergencies. There is an urgent need to assess the level of resilience of health facilities in regard to human related violence and to implement measures to strengthen their security and preparedness in operating in insecure contexts.

This webinar will present the Security Survey for health facilities, a diagnostic tool developed under the framework of the Health Care in Danger Initiative by the ICRC Water and Habitat Unit and supported by the International Hospital Federation, Médecins Sans Fronitères and the World Health Organisation. The tool seeks to:

- 1. Assess the current level of preparedness of any facility to continue operating in an insecure environment;
- 2. Identify which interventions should be prioritized to increase that level of preparedness.

This survey can be used by any facility that provides health care for people in the event of conflict or violence.

The tool was completed in 2017 and has been applied in more than 10 countries, currently facing an armed conflict or high levels of violence.
